



Law Enforcement Survey



2009

- **285,000 calls for service.**
 - **2,760 involved a mental health incident.**
 - **348 required transport to hospital.**
 - **Averaged 3.4 hours per call.**
 - **1.4 hours of that spent in the E.R.**


JAIL




