What is a Risk Pool??

- Currently there are over 500 in the US
- Not an insurance company
- Not a full transfer of risk
- Non-profit 501-C 4 entity that enables its members to share in the risk of financial loss collectively as a single group

How is a pool different?

- Not driven by profit – different set of goals
- Managed by its members – not stockholders
- Closed to non-affiliated – related entities only

Pool Stats

- Originally formed 32 years ago
- 67 of 100 Counties are pool members
- \$4.2 billion in property covered
- 11,000 vehicles
- Over 24,000 employees
- Process 2,300 claims each year

What are our goals?

- Consistent protection
- Price stability
- Member directed coverage consideration
- Enhanced risk management services
- Continued coverage design update

Member Training Stats

- Over 110 member RM visits a month
 - General Driver Safety
 - Transit Operations
 - Slip & Fall Prevention
 - Safety Leadership Development
 - IH Sampling
 - Workplace Assessment
 - Other Safety & Risk Reduction Topics
- Each Specialist provides 12-15 sessions a month

Edgecombe – Gerald Honeyblue

- Defensive driver training for all county employees
- Slips, trips & falls training for supervisors and department heads
- Supervisor safety training
- Incident investigation training for supervisors.

Carteret – Gerald Honeyblue

- Defensive Driver training for Transit Department
- Incident investigation training for supervisors and the safety committee
- Hazard recognition training for the safety committee

Anson –Stuart Darden

- Defensive driver training of transit drivers, Bloodborne Pathogens and First Aid training.
- Performed mold testing at Parks & Rec, the jail, courthouse, DSS and the Administration Building. Prepared report for Board of Commissioners on findings at Park & Rec Building.
- Performed safety inspections at all county facilities.
- Completed ergonomic assessments for employees at DSS and the probation office.
- Participated in the annual Safety & Health Fair, and attends most safety committee meetings.
